Latest coronavirus statistics in Victoria

As of 18 June 2020, the Victorian Chief Health Officer reported:

- the state's number of COVID-19 cases was 1,780 there were 18 new cases since the day before.
- 4 people are in Victorian hospitals with COVID-19, including 2 in intensive care. 19 people have died.
- 192 cases have an unknown source of infection, no change since the day before.
- 1,678 people have recovered. More than 621,000 tests have been completed. Victoria has the highest testing per capita in Australia.

Guidance on elective surgery and reducing and preventing COVID-19 infection

As reported in COVID-19 newsflash #12 the Victorian Government expects elective surgery to be at 75 per cent capacity by the end of June, and increasingly to 100% during July.

Aged care nurses and carers should ask their employer to confirm retention bonus application

Aged care nurses, personal care workers and other eligible aged care workers will only receive the aged care workforce COVID-19 retention bonus if their employer makes an application.

ANMF is encouraging eligible members to use this template letter (<u>bit.ly/agedcareletter</u>) to write to their employer asking for written confirmation that they have made an application for the bonus on their behalf.

Aged care workforce retention bonus applications opened Monday 15 June and close 2pm, Monday 20 July. Employers must make the application via the Federal Government's GrantConnect website.

Private-for-profit, not-for profit and public sector aged care nurses and personal care workers and other aged care employees are eligible for the retention bonus.

Full-time, part-time and casual workers are all eligible. Nurses and carers employed less than four weeks before the application date are still eligible.

The two-part payment, which will be taxed, includes:

- full-time 'direct care' workers will receive \$800 in July and September.
- in-home care workers will receive \$600 per quarter in July and September.

Payment will be based on hours worked in the four weeks before the application date.

Personal protection equipment update

ANMF continues to raise members' concerns about personal protective equipment at the Safer Care Victoria PPE committee. These weekly meetings will now become fortnightly.

DHHS is advising health services to discard any stored used PPE. The PPE Taskforce says the need to keep used PPE is no longer a priority. The taskforce continues to investigate ways to safely reuse PPE if there are supply issues in the future.

Discussions have started examining national PPE co-ordination that could simplify some of the access, storage and stock level issues experienced by public, private and community health services.

More funding to support nurses' and midwives' health and wellbeing

On 6 June Health Minister Jenny Mikakos announced an additional \$350,000 to support the health and wellbeing of Victorian nurses and midwives and nursing and midwifery students.

The Nursing and Midwifery health Program Victoria (NMHPV) will use the funding to expand its telehealth services and respond to the expected increased demand, as a result of the pandemic, for its screening, assessment, referrals and individual and group support sessions.

The NMHPV is a unique service for nurses and midwives with sensitive mental health, alcohol or substance use or family violence issues. It is run by nurses and provides free, independent and confidential support.

Victorian nurses and midwives originally funded the program, established in 2006, through their nursing and midwifery registration fees to the Nurses Board of Victoria. Funding became uncertain following the move to national registration. In 2017 the Andrews Government announced it would provide the important service with recurring funding.
