Restrictions extended and amended

Acting Premier James Merlino has announced a seven-day extension to the circuit-breaker lockdown with some amendments. This will provide a 14-day cycle to understand how and where the COVID-19 virus is moving. Read the Acting Premier's statement https://bit.ly/3uHCSbS

Restriction changes for Metropolitan Melbourne

Restrictions will be extended for another seven days from 11.59pm, Thursday 3 June.

The five reasons to leave home continue:

- shopping for necessary goods and services (one person per household, once per day, a support person can accompany if required)
- caregiving or compassionate reasons
- authorised work or permitted education, or work interstate (nurses, midwives and personal care workers are authorised workers)
- exercise (up to two hours, with one other person or members of your household)
- receive a COVID-19 vaccination

The travel limit will be extended to 10km from place of primary residence, except:

- to access necessary goods and services where those goods and services cannot be accessed closer than 10km from home.
- to visit an intimate partner
- to visit a person in your "single bubble"
- allowed to travel for authorised work and permitted education
- work at an interstate location (where permitted by another state)
- care and compassionate reasons (specific exemptions apply)

Retail: essential retail can open, all other retail remains closed. All retail required to use the Service Vic QR code app required to record attendance

Education: Year 11 and Year 12 students, students of Unit 3/4 VCE subjects or final year VCAL and IB students can return to the classroom.

Authorised work: The list of authorised work has been extended.

All other restrictions remain in place.

Proposed restriction changes for regional Victoria (subject to health advice)

Restrictions have been extended in regional Victoria, and the Victorian Government is proposing some easing of restrictions (subject to health advice) from 11.59pm, Thursday 3 June. The proposed changes include:

- regional Victorians will be able to leave home for any reason
- face masks remain in place
- public gatherings permitted for up to 10 people
- if you can work from home, continue to work from home. Capacity limits for workplace
- schools return to face-to-face learning for all year levels
- higher-education and training continue to study from home if you can
- funerals no more than 50 people
- weddings no more than 10 people
- outdoor physical recreation and sport a maximum patron cap of 50 people per venue. Group sizes and density limits apply
- general retail: open, with some density limits. All retail required to use the Service Vic QR code app required to record attendance
- hairdressing, beauty, personal care: open for services where you can keep a mask on
- hospitality food and drink facilities, food courts can open for seated service only with a 50-person cap

Private aged care worker vaccination blitz – 2 June to 6 June

Workers in private aged care facilities, including nurses and personal care workers, and the residential disability sector have priority access at walk-in vaccination hubs around Victoria from Wednesday 2 June to Sunday 6 June (inclusive).

Private aged care members can walk in to one of the following state vaccination centres, between 9am and 4pm, and present evidence of their employment:

- · Royal Exhibition Building
- Melbourne Convention and Exhibition Centre (MCEC)
- Sandown Racecourse
- Melbourne Showgrounds
- Former Ford Factory Geelong
- Bendigo Community Clinic
- Ballarat Mercure Hotel and Convention Centre
- Shepparton Showgrounds McIntosh Centre
- Traralgon Racecourse
- Wodonga Vaccination Hub

Bring your Medicare care, photo ID and proof of occupation (such as your work ID card, letter from your employer or a completed Eligibility Declaration Form https://bit.ly/2SOShKe) to any of the vaccination centres providing priority access.

Private aged care staff are still eligible to attend all other vaccination centres or their GP but if it is not one of the 10 centres named above, they will need to go through the general booking process.

Federal Aged Care Services Minister 'comfortable' with vaccine rollout

Federal Aged Care Services Minister Richard Colbeck has confirmed the Morrison Government does not have oversight over the numbers of private aged care workers who have been vaccinated.

Senator Colbeck also says he is 'comfortable' with the rate of staff vaccination which appears to be under 10 per cent of the workforce – though this is based on the government's 2016 data.

The Morrison Government does not know how many aged care staff have had one or two vaccination doses or none. Providers will be asked to provide that information through a new portal after completing a survey.

Federal Health and Aged Care Minister Greg Hunt and Senator Colbeck promised in a media release on 16 February 2021 (https://bit.ly/3wPlt2n) that private aged care staff would be vaccinated in their facilities via an in-reach program. This has not happened unless there have been left over resident vaccines.

Private aged care needs an aged care minister who understands the urgent need for reform. We need a minister who is motivated and has the back of residents, nurses and personal care workers. We need a minister who will not rest until the sector is protected from COVID-19.

ANMF have been calling for the Morrison Government to hand over the vaccinations and responsibility for vaccinating to the state government but like our members, we have been ignored.

ANMF is now calling for Senator Colbeck's resignation.

\$450 test and isolation payment

The Victorian Government provides a \$450 test and isolation payment to workers required to isolate after taking a COVID-19 test who don't have access to paid leave. This is for private aged care workers too.

\$1500 disaster leave payment

The Federal Government provides a \$1500 disaster leave payment if you tested positive or were identified as a close contact and have to isolate for 14 days. Private aged care workers are eligible for the payment if you do not have access to paid leave during your isolation period.

Emergency accommodation for healthcare workers

The Victorian Government provides the 'frontline accommodation program' for health care workers if they need support to quarantine or isolate safely.

Private aged care nurses and personal care workers are eligible to access this program.

Vaccination adverse event response and special paid leave

Public sector nurses and midwives who experience an expected adverse event following the COVID-19 vaccination that impacts your ability to work are eligible for up to two days special paid leave following each dose.

ANMF is encouraging all other employers to follow the Victorian Health Department's advice for special leave for these circumstances. ANMF is lobbying the Commonwealth Government to provide this leave to private aged care staff.
